



We are very sorry to announce the untimely death of Michael K. Brame, editor of *Linguistic Analysis*. Born in 1944, he received his PhD from MIT in 1970 (dissertation: “Arabic Phonology: Implications for Phonological Theory and Historical Semitic”; thesis advisor: Morris Halle; committee: Hugh Matthews, Noam Chomsky), and taught at the University of Washington from 1971 to 2004. During his lifetime Mike accomplished many extraordinary things, not least of which was the founding of *Linguistic Analysis* in 1975. The journal is now in its 35th year of publication. He was very pleased that we would publish this Festschrift for Professor Lambek. Mike died on August 16, 2010. He leaves behind his wife Galina, their two children Alexandra and Michael Paul, and his grown daughter by a previous marriage, Roxanne. He will be greatly missed.

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
